Nature ramble for families

Saturday 14th July 10.00am – 1.00pm

Starting at the Church Room.
A nature ramble for families
An opportunity for children, accompanied by their parents, to search for bugs, name plants, birds and trees on the Stevington Footpaths under the guidance of local expert Pat Knight.

This event was inspired by the Stevington Natural History Book and Lost Words, a book by Robert McFarlane and Jackie Morris, which won the beautiful book of the year award in 2017 and was the Hay Festival book of the year 2017.

In 2007, the new edition of the *Oxford Junior Dictionary* introduced new words such as "broadband" while others, describing the natural world disappeared. *The Lost Words* makes no mention of the dictionary and Macfarlane deftly insults the *OJD* with a taste of its own medicine by ignoring it. Instead, in a book of spells rather than poems, exquisitely illustrated by Morris, Macfarlane gently, firmly and meticulously restores the missing words. Acorn, blackberry, bluebell, conker and "perhaps the one that cut the deepest" for Morris, "kingfisher", are lovingly returned to future generations of children.

On our nature ramble we will find and identify grasses, flowering plants, trees and shrubs, animals and birds. We will compile a list of all the things we find and report back in a future edition of the Stevington Magazine. It should be a lovely opportunity for families to walk together and learn more about the beautiful flora and fauna on the Stevington footpaths.

Light refreshments will be provided.

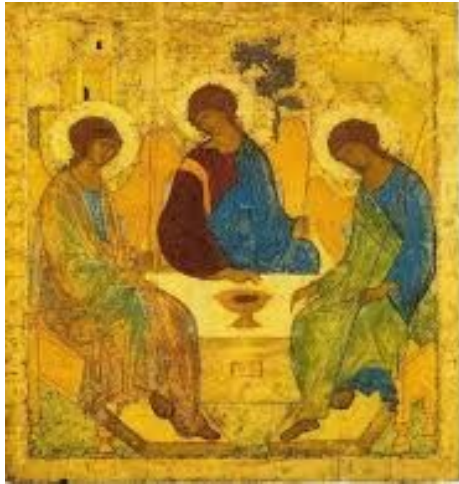

Icon Painting

Sister Esther is running a Non Residential Icon Painting workshop in All Saints Turvey church on the following dates:

August 14/15/16 +21/22/23

From 9:45 to 4:30 with a break for Eucharist (for those who wish) and lunch. This is one course split into two parts.

Icon Painting is an ancient and sacred art which is gaining in popularity in the West and has seen a great revival both in the East and West since mid-last century. Because Christ has permeated matter we use natural pigments with pure powder pigment which we mix with egg yolk and water and paint onto a specially prepared Gesso board. Using this technique, the Icon does not fade over time (as with other artificial paints) but hardens and increases with intensity of colour. The approximate cost will be £100 plus to cover special paints and boards but participants will need to bring their own pencils, rubbers and tracing paper. You do not need to be able to draw and the course is suitable for beginners or those more experienced.

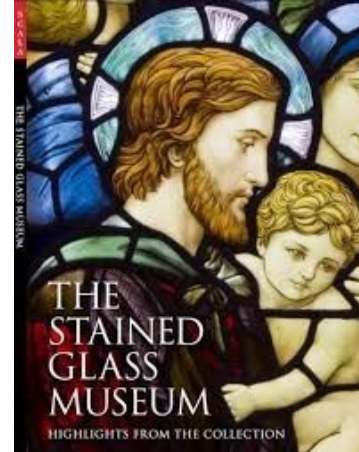

visit to ELY CATHEDRAL on
Saturday 6th October 2018



I am organising a trip to Ely Cathedral also to include a visit to the only dedicated stained glass museum in the Country on Saturday the 6th October. There will be 2 coach pick ups, the first from Carlton School at 8am and then the cross (near the church) in Turvey at 8:10am. We need 30 to make this trip viable and the closing date for letting me know is Friday the 10th August. The cost will be approximately £25 per head and this includes the coach, admission to the cathedral plus the stained glass museum. There will be a tour of the Cathedral at 10:00am, then you are free to visit the museum and wander the shops (very short walking distance) and have lunch. The river is about a 10 minute walk for those who are able to walk further. Let's hope we get dry weather like last year.

WAT WALK

This walk will start from The Barley Mow, Cosgrove MK19 7JD which is a village just outside the north west edge of Milton Keynes. We meet at the pub for food ordering at 10am for a 10:15 Start. This 5 mile level walk without stiles starts with a traverse through a horse tunnel under the Grand Union Canal, and includes a stretch along the towpath including Iron Trench Aqueduct across the river Ouse.
